When we became members of the United Methodist church, we vowed to uphold it with our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service and our witness. Many of you chose to do so and completed a Seeking the Consecrated Life sheet and placed it on the altar during the service.

The Consecration Service Committee reviewed the submitted sheets and wanted to share a general synopsis of your responses. This information will also be shared with the Leadership Committee, and they will use it to plan, develop, and implement programs, studies, activities, and opportunities to help you work toward your new commitment.

We found an overwhelming interest in the area of prayer. We note that many want to develop a daily prayer life to include prayer for those around us, for Paxton, and for those in need, as well as helping to build or join small prayer groups.

The area of presence included attending worship services, participating in worship, and growing into the full measure of the presence of Christ. Some of you indicated a willingness to be a liturgist, increase your regular attendance, and reach out more to others.

In giving back to God, many of you wanted help in identifying ways in which your skills can be applied where needed and committing more time to the life of the congregation. Others of you committed to increasing your financial giving. There was also a desire to help fund special projects.
