A Christmas Carol

Charles Dickens classic story <u>A Christmas Carol</u> was originally titled <u>A Christmas Carol in Prose</u>, <u>Being a Ghost Story of Christmas</u>. Dickens' story is not a song, though like a traditional carol, it is divided into verses or staves, with each section offering an independent thought. Dickens has us love to dislike the lead character, Ebenezer Scrooge, who receives visits from 4 ghosts prior to Christmas; the least favorite time of the year for Scrooge. Each of these ghosts though, bring us and Scrooge the message of Hope, Love, Peace, and Joy of Jesus for all people.

Like the carols we sing each year at Christmas, Dickens perhaps wanted us to share the story over and over again, year after year, in order to bring people together in joy and love. Join us each week as we sing our favorite Christmas Carols and study in Worship and Sunday School how the lessons of <u>A Christmas Carol</u> apply to us today.
